The ECF is established to pursue the following objectives:

- a. to promote climate and energy policies pertaining to the promotion of greenhouse gas emission reduction; to promote and contribute to the international role of Europe in limiting climate change; to further and promote efficient and safe energy consumption; to sustainably develop clean technologies relating to energy consumption; and to minimize harmful emissions (including ozone gas emissions) in view of climate change;
- b. and to educate and raise awareness among the general public regarding the topics described in sub-paragraph “a” above and regarding any related topics, all in the broadest sense.

The ECF endeavours to realise its objectives by raising funds and accepting donations and, subsequently, by organising programmes and re-granting its financial means to achieve its objectives. The ECF is a non-profit organisation.

To achieve the ECF's mission and vision of a green, democratic and peaceful Europe, it focuses on eight strategic portfolios, from fossil-free energy to international affairs. Across these focus areas, it grounds its strategies at the country level with 10 national and regionally focused teams. To help deepen and broaden public support for climate action, citizen engagement and cultural change underpin all of its work.

As a strategic grant-maker, the ECF funds a diverse range of over 700 partners, collaborating with them to identify and support interventions that get us closer to climate safety. As a network enabler, it fosters a stronger, more resilient network by helping partners build their capacities and create new connections. As a narrative shaper, it uses strategic communications to inform key decision-makers, foster discussion on climate, and strengthen broad-based support for climate action. As a thought leader, the ECF works with its partners to set the agenda and co-develop impactful strategies for climate action.

How does the organisation generate income or revenue?

The ECF aims to realise its objectives by raising funds and accepting donations, following careful evaluation, compliance due diligence checks, and application of the risk matrix; and subsequently by organising programmes and re-granting its financial means to achieve its objectives.

The ECF is not an endowed foundation and relies on fundraising to finance its activities.

The ECF seeks financial support from various charitable sources, including foundations, charity lotteries, and individual donors.
